

Greetings, good Gentles of the Lonely Tower, and all who may visit with us on this joyous day.

I, Miklos Farma, am hosting a Mathom Swap as part of the festivities for the day. (description of a mathom will be in the link at the bottom of this missive.)

Bring an item which you wish to swap, wrapped.

The item can be something you already have which you wish to gift or regift, or it can be something new which you purchase. If you choose to buy something new, please don't spend too much.

When it comes time for the exchange, all who brought an item will roll a pair of dice (normal dice, not strange extra-sided ones). Then when your number is called, you step up and pick out an item. If multiple people all step up at the same time, they will roll dice to find their order.

After all the items are chosen, we shall open all of them together to find what we have.

At this point, if another person has an item you really like, you can try and swap with them. Or, you can arrange to swap with another person who has something the gentle holding the item you want really wants, and then do your original swap.

From the Chatelaine

What is Twelfth Night?

In England, during the middle ages Twelfth Night was the culmination of the Christmas season, celebrating the arrival of the three wise men. Here in Lonely Tower, Twelfth Night is our annual winter event, drawing about 300 people from around the Kingdom.

Lonely Tower's Twelfth Night event will have several different things to do. There will be two rattan tourneys—one is a Novice Tourney for newer and inexperienced fighters, and the other will be the Sir Thomas de Chateau Noir Social Club tourney. Sir Thomas was Lonely Tower's first Baron, and his favorite style of tournament was the 'bear pit' or 'hold the field' tourney. In this style of tournament, all the fighters line up and the first two fight. The winner holds the field, and fights the next person in line. The loser reports to the list table and reports who the winner was, then goes to the end of the line and waits for his next turn. This is a fun style of tournament, because there are a lot of fights, and you get to take a break whenever you need to by just stepping out of line, and you can chat with those also waiting in line and get to know your fellow fighters. The winner will receive a traveling trophy—a boar spear which they will return the following year for the next winner.

There will also very likely be Cut and Thrust tournaments. Last year they followed the same format as the rattan tournaments, with a Novice tourney and a Social Club.

The Barony may also hold the Baronial Rattan Championship if there is time—format to be determined.

In addition to the fighting, there will be a class on Tournament Heraldry and How to Run a List Field, with hands-on practice at the Baronial Championship Tourney. There will be several A&S competitions, a heraldic consultation table, a silent auction, and preprint painting. The Barony has a Book Sale table to raise money for the Chatelaine's office.

Two guilds will be holding meetings—the Lampworkers (Glass) Guild, and the Scribal Guild. These meetings are open to anyone interested in their activities, and are a good way to meet artisans and learn.

There are no plans for merchants at this event—for a full shopping experience, go to Kris Kinder on December 8th in the Barony of Forgotten Sea (Kansas City).

There will be planned children's activities.

Following all this, will be a Royal Court, and a wonderful feast prepared on site by lady Wulfrith and her crew. The theme for the feast will be the Twelve Days of Christmas, but I have been assured there will not be twelve removes!

From the Anser Pursuivant

Rather than a central theme to my letter this month, I decided that I would compile a listing of short heraldic facts that do not lend themselves to a full article. I hope you find them interesting, and perhaps even one or two of them useful!

In heraldry, a hedgehog is often called an 'urchin' and is often depicted with grapes speared on its spines (Presumably to show that they are sharp.) Suddenly the sea-urchin's name makes more sense, no?

We register heraldry, not persona. If you have a persona that lived before heraldry existed, you can still register heraldry! If you want a charge that was only used in German heraldry, but your persona is Persian, no problem!

A highly stylized nettle leaf is found in German heraldry, and it is called a nesselblatt.

The best (IMHO) starting source for anyone with a Norse or 'Viking' persona is the website 'The Viking Answer Lady.' <u>http://</u><u>www.vikinganswerlady.com</u> The author is a long time member of the SCA, a peer, and a Herald Extraordinary.

The famed monster of many modern day movies, the werewolf, is also a heraldic charge (Used in the late 16th century crest of Kaylewaye). It does look a bit different, though. It is depicted as a wolf with human ears, and human hands instead of feet.

Why yes, a niddy-noddy IS an acceptable period charge. While the name isn't period, we still use in in the SCA for clarity's sake.

In heraldry, we usually call a giraffe by its medieval name: a camelopard.

A wig, a tress of hair, and even a beard are found as heraldic charges (and not often used in SCA heraldry!)

In heraldry, a broom is a type of plant, and a besome is a bundle of twigs bound to the end of a staff, and used for brushing or sweeping.

A sea-lion is the half fish, joined to the top half of a lion. A natural se-lion can be found at Henry Doorley zoo.

To many people's distress, Celtic knot work is not registerable as heraldry. It does make for awesome artwork though!)

A bat is also called a "reremouse", "flittermouse" or a "chausoriz" in heraldic blazons.

Hungry for Italian food? Bread, cheese, and garlic are all period heraldic charges.

Examples of bugs found in period heraldry include the "ant", the "bee", the "beetle", the "butterfly", the "grasshopper", the "spider" the "stag beetle", and the "fly",
