


### Chatelaine Chat

#### Demo 101

#### What is a demo?

There are 2 types of demos that we typically do. The first is an education based demo. This is usually done for schools, scouts, or other youth groups. The focus of these are for youth to learn about what we do, specific skills, and about history. BLT's largest education demo is our annual Education Day in partnership with Bellevue Berry Farm's Renaissance Faire of Nebraska and the Catholic schools of Omaha and Lincoln. We regularly have over 300 students, teachers, and chaperones in attendance. We have also done demos for various scout troops, as well.

The other type of demo is a recruitment/general public demo. We usually have a couple of these a year. We partner with the Renaissance Faire of Nebraska for one and UNO for another. These demos are to garner interest and to educate the public about our unique social club. It's an opportunity to show off our garb, fighting skills, and arts and sciences projects! It's a chance to introduce people to what we do, and invite them to join us in our endeavors.

### What do you do at a demo?

We do a lot at demos! We have heavy combat, and sometimes cut and thrust. We have people talking and explaining what is happening during the fighting. We have people showing different arts and sciences, like calligraphy, viking swing rope braiding, illumination, sewing, spinning, and weaving. We have people playing period era games like 9 Man Morris. We have someone teaching about heraldry, and allowing folks to draw their own. We have leather workers and woodworkers displaying what they make and how they do it. We let folks try on accessories and take pictures. We have lots of hands-on crafts that people are free to try and learn about. So, what does that mean for you? It means you can volunteer to teach or show off your awesome artistic skills, help with fighting, and talk with interested people and give them contact materials for our local barony!

#### Best practices at a demo:

- Be Early! Get to site early to set up your stuff if you are bringing materials to show, or to change into garb.
- Be friendly! Make sure to ask them about themselves and what interests them. That way you're better able to direct them to what we do in the SCA, since anything done in the modern world has a SCA counterpart.
- Do NOT overwhelm them. Talk to them a little bit about what it is we offer and make sure to give
  them a business card. Invite them to our next gathering. Have them follow us on Facebook or
  Instagram. Don't overwhelm them with the minutiae of what we do. Try to avoid using SCA slang.
  Allow them to learn slowly and discover things for themselves.
- 4. Be Positive! Share your positive experiences in the SCA. Remember this is a public event and so we should always focus on all the different things that make the SCA a fun hobby. Never talk negatively about another aspect of the hobby, people, etc. If you don't know about something a potential member asks about, or you don't like it. Introduce them to someone who does that particular activity.
- Remember we are recreating and trying to embody chivalric behaviors. Try to exemplify that behavior during the demo.
- 6. Help set up and tear down! This is the hardest work we do for a demo. Setting up and tearing down our site. We usually have a few tents 3-4 and our list field. The more people who help set up and tear down the quicker we can get everything done!

Thank you for your help to ensure our upcoming demos are successful!
