

Storage

Our storage fee has gone up \$8 per month, effective 1 July 2020. This raises our annual fee from \$1084 to \$1115.

Bank Card--information only

Need to add the new Seneschal, remove Kay, and leave Ann since she will be the new deputy.

This has to be done in person, with the new seneschal, myself, and one other signatory--probably Ann. Once I have the required information (name, address, phone number, membership number and expiry), I will send the change to kingdom and society for approval. When that is approved, I will make the appointment with the bank. We are required to bring two (2) forms of official photo ID with us; the appointment takes a couple of hours.

And we will need to do it again when the new Exchequer takes over...no we cannot wait and do it just once. The society would audit us in a hot minute and hell would break loose.

The Coronation bid looks fine to me. Are we going to get new paperwork done for the change of dates? If so, then I say yes. If not, then we need to discuss it further.


Financial Committee Notes Cont.

Garden Grotto & Cooking with Cristina





(peppermint on the left, mint on the right...and escaped sprouts can be seen on the far upper right and lower right of the photo)

This rather wondrous herb has been around for an unknown amount of time...it has been passed down in written history as least as far back as Pliny in the turn of the era (BC to AD). Loved by most, it has innumerable shining qualities, within the body and without.

There are dozen of species of this herb—some grow, flower and give seed; while others are hybridized and can only grow on by cuttings. I have several in my yard and hesitate to specifically name them without a DNA test. However, for the purposes of this article, I will call one into the court of reckoning, and call it "Mint".

This mint was grown from seed a decade ago—he is now a beast of epic magnitude. I do not exaggerate; he has sent runners from his bed 20 yards underground to pop up near my apple tree (or what was an apple tree and is now a twig due to a neighbour's herbicidal tendencies). He has also sent runners the other direction, around the house, through brick and stone, to invade my flower beds.

Beware.

Mint, he makes due with his spot in the back—he has shade until noon, protection from the worst of the winds and snow, and mostly has water to suit. His cousin, I will call him Peppermint, is not happy with his decade-long location with much less of everything—but he keeps coming back every year. Wet feet, in plant speak, means they have a higher water requirement and don't mind occasionally soggy roots. Not living in water, it won't do well, but the sporadic drenching days make them happy. Ideally, consistent heavy water, protection from the worst elements, and afternoon shade would be ideal—say the eastern side of the house. I do have mints on the south, north, and east sides of the house—west wins. The north side gets too much sun due to angles; the south is the main bed due to duration and the sprinklers give the runners it sends out the majority of the water. However, the mint on the south side is the first thing up in the spring and lives till nearly January out my backdoor.

Remember my warning of the invasiveness? Easy fix is to keep it in a pot—don't be fooled by the "put a pot in the ground" ideas...mint is sneaky and smart and determined. It will escape like a toddler and you will never eradicate it.

A nice thing about mint is its "cut and come again" philosophy. It is a bifurcate; meaning that it sends out two side sprigs at nodes, and those side nodes will then split and then again in true hydra-style. This is common with all Lamiaceae such as lavender, basil, and mint. What this means, is that you can cut off the growing tip for harvest or pruning, and it will branch out—creating a more shrubby appearance rather than a sky-scraper. Handy for keeping rambunctious Mint in check and semi-contained.

After harvesting, wash the sprigs well...soak them for a few minutes in cool water and swish gently.

Many garden natives love to hitch a ride and can eat your harvest as it sits on your counter.

Mint can be used fresh or dried. I find fresh works well in tzatziki sauce, salads, and with fresh fruit. For teas and sekanjabins, I recommend dried as the oils are more concentrated and the results tastes more minty and less green. I strongly urge you away from drying in a dehydrator, oven, or microwave as the oil content can be lowered.

Cooking Corner: Drying Mint...and pretty much any leafy herb

Requirements: Fresh herbs, needle & Drying these herbs is reminiscent of stringing popcorn for the holidays. Idea is to slowly dry the herbs at low temperatures with plenty of airflow to inhibit mold. Drying concentrates the flavors and can keep you in your favorite herbs all winter.

Some herbs don't dry so well—Italian basil being one of them. Not to say that you can't, just that the flavor-profile is a bit lesser than its fresher brethren. On the other end, oregano and marjoram totally come into their powerhouse of flavor after drying.



Next easiest (definitely easier on the other end) is to pull the leaves off the sprig and string them like a popcorn string (or a lei). These do pose the possible problem of retaining moisture between the leaves as they are pressed closely together. This can be solved with a daily walk by them and shifting them apart, keeping them from being pasted together.



After a week of hanging, crush a leaf with your fingers; if it crushes, it's done—if it crumples it needs more time.



Once dry, however you manage it, keep them in an airtight container in a dark, cool place. Empty glass jars of various origins and the back corner of my pantry are my preferred.
