


Bardic	July	This provides an overview of our kingdom's nickname and resources for music and songs that are an essential part of our kingdom.



Nasturtiums

Yes, it is still full winter here in the Lonely Tower; but that just means we get to dream about spring for that much longer. Dream of the bright greens of fresh sproutlings and the furious bursts of color from those first spring blooms.

One of the first things I put into the garden is the nasturtiums. These plants have a long, decorated history...but not on the European continent. These are native to the Americas and were cherished by the Incas. It wasn't until the 16th century that they made their way to European gardeners' hands.

Though they are a glorious flower with a dizzyingly rich honey scent, they have true power as a spring vegetable. The succulent, peppery leaves are rich in vitamin C and lutein (believed to aid in sight and retinal maintenance) making them a welcome fresh food after winter's stews and preserved foods.







Now, nasturtiums as we know them are typically genus Tropaeolum majus, minus, and peltophorum. The Nasturtium officinale is actually water cress—a vegetable from India. Though the leaf structure and taste are very similar. These plants can trail up to a dozen feet nearly taking over the garden spaces, or be small, compact rounds of lilypad-esque leaves shading flame-coloured blossoms.

All parts of the plant can be eaten. Leaves and flowers are delightfully peppery and fresh in salads and sandwiches. The blossoms—fresh or dried—can be brewed into a tea high in vitamin C and believed to have antibiotic properties—many references to aiding in the relief of urinary tract infections has been found (though not verified by modern medicine). The dried seeds were ground and used as pepper substitute. Fresh seeds can even be pickled and used as capers…so lovely with smoked salmon.

Growing nasturtiums is child-like in its simplicity—push the seed into just about any kind of dirt and wait. They can be planted outside up to 2 weeks prior to the last frost date—about May Day here in Lonely Tower. Plant them about half an inch deep and keep moist but not wet. Nasturtiums aren't picky about soil—in fact they don't seem to be fond of highly fertile soil, giving few blooms but loads of leaves. A lighter soil is best, but truly, they will grow most any place that has mostly sun (6-8 hours) and moderate amounts of water. They will sprout in about a week with small, almost hexagonal leaves.

As a companion plant, there are no vegetables I have found that do not benefit from having nasturtiums in close proximity. They draw pollinators and predatory insects in droves—bumblebees love them almost as much as they love cucumber blossoms. Plant them between long-term crops such as kale and squash and beans for a lovely living mulch.

As the blooms fade—if you aren't picking them for food or tea—do not deadhead them as is recommended with so many other flowers. For these flower stems is where we obtain the glorious seeds for later plantings.



Seeds are normally triple-lobed and look like little pale green brains. When they are ripe, they will roll off the stem into your hands with no pressure at all—if you have to tug at all, they aren't ripe and may not be viable enough to sprout. These seeds can be picked and dried for later use as plantings or seasonings, pickled as capers, or even left on the plant to ripen and fall; letting nature do its thing in the garden is never a poor choice.

If you choose to dry the flowers for later use, do so out of direct sunlight. Needle and string method works well, or a very low heat in a dehydrator. Then store them in a sealed container out of the light—make sure they are fully dry else they may mildew and spoil the lot.
